

# HUD-Residential Resilience Guidelines

## Kick-Off Meeting

Monday, February 24, 2020

### MEETING NOTES

#### General: Key Items

1. **Introductions** – The 32-Members of the Advisory Group highlighted their background and expertise in resilience. The Advisory Group has expertise in all major natural hazard categories. The Advisory Group members live throughout the country.
2. **Basic Rules and Procedures** – Home Innovation provide an overview of the basic rules and procedures for developing the Residential Resilience Guidelines. These rules and procedures are based on the process that Home Innovation uses to develop standards – although the HUD Residential Resilience Guidelines are **NOT** a standard.
3. **Defining Resilience** – The 32-Members of the Advisory Group discussed their understanding of resilience and considered many possible approaches to designing the guidelines. Although no decision has been made, most members thought that having a “Good-Better-Best” approach was preferred.
4. **Task Groups** – The 32-Members of the Advisory Group discussed major categories of natural hazards and what Task Groups should be defined. The list is as follows:
  - Wind:** Tornado, Hurricane, Micro-burst, Tree damage
  - Water:** Rising water, Storm surge, Moisture intrusion, Landslide
  - Fires:** Wild fires, Home fires
  - Earthquake:** Tremor, High magnitude
  - Auxiliary:** Pests, Volcano, Sustainability (prevent structural failure from deprivation over time)

#### Follow-Up: Key Items

1. Invite applicants to join the Task Groups
2. Keep up to date with the status of the Project through the Webpage
3. Schedule the next meeting with the Advisory Group
